Projects We Support

The Foundation for Red Deer Public Schools offers programming that is considered to be "Above and Beyond for Children" initiatives. These are outside of public education funded programming and are only possible through community support.

Each of these opportunities impact many students and enhance 'life chances for students'.

Our Programs

Bright Start provides access to quality prekindergarten programming for children who we already know will struggle when they begin school.

Reading College makes a real difference for 65 Grade 2 students who are struggling readers and writers.

Finish Line connects with students who are no longer attending high school, have not completed their graduation requirements, and yet are within reach of achieving their high school diploma.

Step Up reduces barriers for students by providing basic necessities to those who go without.

Come Grow With Us is a three seasons greenhouse that allows students to develop practical, valuable life skills and gain new perspectives on food.

Music Plus provides musical instruments to students, whose families are not able to afford them.







Enhancing Educational Opportunities for Students in Kindergarten to Grade 6

This year, The Foundation supported several initiatives aimed at strengthening literacy, mathematics, and cultural understanding among students. By providing valuable resources and engaging opportunities, we are dedicated to empowering learners from Kindergarten through Grade 6, ensuring they develop the skills and knowledge necessary for future success.

To strengthen literacy skills among our youngest learners, The Foundation supported the purchase of **The Bug Club Morphology**, a comprehensive literacy resource designed for students in Kindergarten to Grade 5. This engaging program empowers students to develop essential reading and language skills that set the foundation for lifelong success.

In addition, we have funded **Math Up Kits** for each student from Kindergarten to Grade 5, providing innovative, hands-on learning tools that make mathematics accessible and enjoyable for all students.

in support of Indigenous education, we sponsoring a speaking engagement with award-winning **Indigenous author David A. Robertson** for Grade 6 students across Red Deer Public Schools. This special event will deepen students' understanding of Indigenous storytelling and perspectives as they conclude their novel study of The Barren Grounds.







General Projects - Ongoing

The Foundation for Red Deer Public Schools is a funder for several projects and programs across the Division that effect many students and schools:


- Body Image Play: Targeting Grade 7
 students by using social action
 drama delivers important
 messages and raises awareness
 about healthy self-esteem and
 lifestyle choices before negative
 behaviours take root.
- Choir Kids: Hundreds of elementary students have the opportunity to sing with their choirs to highlight their talents and love for singing in a concert performance accompanied by the Red Deer Symphony Orchestra.
- Cross Country Ski Loppet: More than 500 students from Grades 4 to 12 participate in a 3-5 km loppet.

- Dawe Run: A cross-country run involving more than 3,500 students from Grades 4 to 12.
- Grow Kids: A full-day program for more than 700 Grade 5 students to experience and explore a variety of physical activities to promote health and wellness as well as develop characteristics and attributes of becoming a good citizen.
- Young Writers Conference: More than 100 Grade 5 students who love to read and write have the opportunity to connect with guest authors, illustrators, news reporters and writers that inspire kids to write.
